Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the start of the new school term. We hope that you have had a lovely Easter break! We are very much looking forward an exciting term ahead for all of the children in Year 2. We hope that the following information proves useful to you, but please feel free to come and discuss any other questions that you may have.

Curriculum:

<u>Topic</u> – Splendid skies <u>English</u>- Stories set in fantasy settings, Information Texts, Poetry <u>Maths</u>- Number and Place Value, Addition and Subtraction, Fractions, Measures including Time and Money, Geometry including properties of shapes and direction and movement, Multiplication and Division <u>RE</u> – What can we learn from sacred books? Science - Plants and Habitats

PE – Athletics, Team Games and Football

<u>SATs</u>

During May the majority of Year 2 children will undertake National SATs tests in reading, spelling, grammar and Maths. Thank you to everyone who attended the parents work shop at the end of March. You should have already had a copy of the information shared during these sessions. If you have any questions regarding the SATs please feel free to come in and talk to us.

Homework:

Children in Year 2 will be given a Maths or Reading Comprehension based piece of homework related to work we have been doing during the week. Homework will be <u>sent home on Fridays</u> in the children's homework books and is to be **completed and handed in by the following Wednesday.**

Spellings – All children will receive spellings each Friday to learn for a test on the following Friday. They will be given them to practice using the look, cover, say, write check method. These spellings will be based around a spelling pattern; however the words will be differentiated depending on the child's group. To extend your child's spelling learning you might like to discuss other words with them that follow the same pattern and practice putting them into sentences. In addition to this, children should also practice spelling Y2 common exception words which can be found as a list within their Home/ School Journal.

Reading - Children are also expected to read every day, as part of their homework. We suggest you encourage your child to read regularly and to bring the book to <u>school every day.</u>

Please ensure that you sign your child's Home School Journal at home each time they read, either to an adult or independently and kindly leave a note in the journal to state that the book has been read/completed where it can then be changed.















<u>PE</u>

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Our weekly PE sessions are now on a Monday and a Friday afternoon. Please ensure that your child has a <u>named PE kit</u> which should consist of a T-shirt, shorts and pumps; they can bring jogging trousers and jumper if it is colder outside and trainers for outdoor lessons only. PE kits should be brought into school in a named drawstring bag please. If for any reason your child is unable to take part in PE lessons we require a note of explanation.

Please can you remind your children that earrings should be removed before PE lessons.

Uniform:

At the beginning of our school year in September 2017, Miss Cooke spoke to the children about taking great pride in their appearance and wearing the correct school uniform. Staff will be reminding children about the uniform expectations at school regularly. Please support us in ensuring that your child wears the correct uniform, thank you.

Recommended Clothing

- Royal blue sweatshirts/cardigan
- White polo shirt
- Grey trousers/skirt/pinafore dress
- Blue checked dress in summer if preferred
- Plain shoes (not trainers)
- Reversible waterproof fleece jacket.

At Howes we ask the children to wear a pair of outdoor shoes to and from school and whilst outside at playtime/lunchtime as this enables them to make the most of the school grounds during the wetter weather. Once they arrive at school we ask the children to change into indoor shoes. Please could we ask you to encourage your child to bring a pair of named indoor shoes to keep at school, such as slippers, school shoes or pumps. Thank you.

Children with long hair should come to school with their hair tied back please.

Jewellery

For safety reasons children should not wear jewellery to school. We ask that children with pierced ears should only wear stud earrings.

Please can we remind you that nail varnish should not be worn at school, thank you.

Playtime Fruit and Snacks:

Fruit at playtime is provided for children in Early Years and Key Stage 1, however if your child wishes to bring in their own snack from home then we are still keen that children think carefully about making healthy choices for their playtime snacks. Children may also bring in a labelled **water** bottle each day, which can be kept in the classroom. Please can all children make sure that they take their water bottle home at the end of the day. Please can we remind you that the children should only bring water in their water bottles, thank you.

Please can we remind you that children should not bring any nuts to school either as a snack or as part of a packed lunch thank you.

Behaviour Expectations

Howes is a friendly and caring community and we are keen for our children to take on these and other values. Our house point system is proving effective at encouraging children to follow our golden rules and values. We would still very much like parents and carers to help us in reinforcing these rules and values with the children.

Please can children be reminded that they should not bring toys into school, unless they have been given permission to do so.

Celebration Assemblies

Our 'Celebration Assembly' takes place on a Friday morning at 9am. This is an opportunity for teachers to nominate two children from each class per week, to receive an award for an aspect of outstanding work, achievement or behaviour. Parents will be invited to come into school for the assembly when their child is awarded their certificate. You will receive a letter on a Wednesday to inform you that your child has been nominated.

Absences and Medical Needs:

We would like to remind you that if your child is going to be absent please telephone the school office at the number above as soon as possible. Any medication that your child requires during the day should be given to the Office, for a First Aider, in the original container and a medical administration consent form needs to be completed. Inhalers must be labelled and be handed in to your child's class teacher to be stored safely in the classroom.

Timings of the day:

The start of a Howes school day in Year 2 begins with an English lesson starting straight after the register is taken. It is therefore very important that all pupils arrive promptly in order to start the school day at 8.55am. So that children are ready to come into school at this time, we would ask that all children are present on the playground at least 5 minutes before the school bell sounds.

The end of the school day for pupils is Key Stage 1 is at 3.15pm. Please note that this is 5 minutes earlier than Key Stage 2 pupils.

Parent Helpers:

At Howes we recognise the valuable contribution that all members of our community make to our school. We are lucky to have so many parents and carers who show commitment to Howes in so many ways. We are always happy to welcome helpers into the classroom, so if you would like to volunteer to help in any way please do come and speak to Mrs Bollands. We may also need additional adult support for our upcoming trips so please let us know if you are available.
